Important Dates

It is that time again.... our annual holiday Christmas Program! Dress
Rehearsal will be on Wednesday, Dec. 21st at 8:30A.M. and the program will start at 1:00P.M. Parents may take their child home after the program is over. However, all parents must come to my room to speak to me, so I know your child is with you. If a relative is picking your child up, you need to send in a signed written permission slip, otherwise I will not be able to release him or her.

<u>Literacy Tips:</u> Have students practice their spelling in clay, using magnetic letters, or typing them on a computer. Read with your child daily to ensure he/she is being fluent and understanding what is being read. Reading books and/or library books should be coming home to practice reading daily.

<u>Math Tips:</u> All students have been added to a new math program call "front row." Students can access the program from home and continue where they left off. The classroom code is 3s3trg. This is a great way to work on all skills learned thus far and MATH FACTS! I am seeing most students making progress, but not all.



For Spelling this week we will work on Christmas words for fun and practice Word Study on Front Row.

There will be NO spelling or READING TEST this week.
