If your child has corrections and I didn't get a chance to work with him or her, I will send the paper home to be completed. I don't enter a grade until the work has been corrected. A few students keep "forgetting" to bring their work back and have to completely redo the assignment during their recess time.

Please return art shirts that were sent home to be washed. Only a couple of students have brought them back. I know that the students will be painting soon and wouldn't want to see their clothes ruined.

The students did a wonderful job designing their landforms and testing on the model I created. I have them displayed in the room.

We will begin on the 7 continents and 4 oceans. Students will be given a study guide to color and practice on for their upcoming test.

I have two colored models with Velcro labels, a smart exchange activity, and erasable maps the students will use for practicing before I will test them.

We will continue with wind and water erosion in science. We will discuss how water can cause erosion to land and what engineers do to prevent mass destruction. Students will become engineers and research; brainstorm, design and test their model on how to lessen wind erosion.

We are working on money in Math. A great way to learn money is to throw a handful of change on the table and have your child:

- 1. Organize the money according to its value
- 2. Name and label the value of each coin
- 3. Count the money using a running total

<u>Literacy Tips:</u> Have students practice their spelling in clay, using magnetic letters, or typing them on a computer. Read with your child daily to ensure he/she is being fluent and understanding what is being read. Reading books and/or library books should be coming home to practice reading daily.

Math Tips: All students have been added to a new math program call "front row." Students can access the program from home and continue where they left off. The classroom code is 3s3trg. This is a great way to work on all skills learned thus far and MATH FACTS!

All students need to work on addition and subtraction facts. Let's go second graders!!!

<u>Social Studies:</u> Rural, Urban & Suburban Communities and their characteristics- Students have flashcards to help them study. Each student will create all three communities using their flashcards.
