11:30-2:45. It is a state assessment that will give me a benchmark to use for developing a program specifically for your child to provide additional help to improve on the skills he/she is lacking. There is a Fall, Winter, and Spring assessment given for comparison and tracking growth or losses made throughout the year. It will be very important that your child is well rested, given a healthy breakfast, and in school on these days unless he/she is sick, of course. Each student will be testing individually in a quiet environment.

<u>Literacy Tips:</u> Reading with your child daily will increase their word recognition, fluency, comprehension, and love for reading. "Good Fit" books allow students to read at their own level and interest. The students may check books out of my leveled book bins, as well.

<u>Math Tips:</u> Students who practice and master their addition and subtraction facts will be more successful in math. Facts are the basic building blocks <u>needed</u> for each consecutive lesson taught. Those who practice 10 minutes a night will find that they will spend less time on math assignments and making corrections on their papers.
